## INTRODUCTION TO CREDIT COURSES

With the present industrial scenario, the recognition and advancement of skills development courses is a significant step towards better job profile prospects, and this goes hand in hand with industry requirements. Now that globalisation is on the rise, the expectations of professional candidates are on the rise. This can be achieved in part by focusing our efforts on industry-specific skills.

Changing developments in every industry demand for better-oriented candidates capable of addressing transition and helping to drive up the pace of growth in the country. The college has aimed at developing the hard skills and soft skills both for the benefit of students. Under the credit courses scheme, it is expected that the learners gain in depth knowledge which should be focused around training that combines the best practices from education, psychology, social work, career counselling, sports, and technology training.

A learner has to earn 132 academic credits to earn his/her graduation degree which comprises 120 academic credits\* + 12 credits from choice-based credit courses. A Credit course is a short-term course for increasing employability and capacity building skills of learners. They are skill-based courses. The learner would need to earn the 12 credit points over three years in addition to the 120 Academic credit points for the core course. (\*1 credit = 30 hours of learning)

In addition to the 132 credits, a learner at R.A. Podar College would need to complete additional 4 (four) mandatory – non-academic credits in the time frame prescribed by the institution. The college has designed the framework and implementation process of the said courses. Two Credits are assigned to each course.

**Kindly note: These credits are NOT inclusive of the 12 credit points to be earned by the learner.**

The two non-academic mandatory courses are:

- Value enrichment course at First year level
- Course on civic responsibility at Third year level

## **GUIDELINES FOR EARNING CREDIT POINTS**

At R.A. Podar College of Commerce and Economics (Autonomous), learners can earn the twelve credits by enrolling in the following:

- Skill and Ability Enhancement Credit Courses
- Online courses
- Extra-Curricular Credit
- Internship
- Student Induction Program

### **Skill and Ability Enhancement Credit Courses**

The Skill and Ability Enhancement Credit Courses are designed and offered by R.A.Podar College of Commerce and Economics (Autonomous) since 2019-20. The courses are designed by subject experts with an intent to promote innovation and incubate the inner talent of the learner. The objective of the credit courses is to enhance the employability skills of the learner. The learners will be evaluated at the completion of the course and awarded a certificate of merit based on their performance.

The students can also earn Credits by completing any online courses other than those mentioned above after seeking approval for the same from the college.

- Every Friday/Saturday, the list of approval status will be displayed on the credit courses page of the college's website. The link to check the approvals is as follows:

- After receiving the approval, the students can commence the approved online course.
- On completion of the online course, the student has to fill the “Submission form”
- The learners are required to submit their report, certificate, PowerPoint presentation or any other evaluation certificate (if available) while filling the form.
- It is strongly advised for the learner to fill the Online Credit Course Completion Form only after they have completed all the Online credit courses they intend to complete in an academic year (For TY learner- at the end of the V Semester), to earn the requisite credit points they have earmarked for earning through online credit courses.

### **Note:**

- No approval shall be given through creditcourse2019 @ rapodar.ac.in from 20th June 2021.
- The student has to make sure that the course selected for earning credit points under the credit courses scheme is of minimum 18 hours. Any course of duration less than 18

hours is not approved by the college for awarding credit points under the credit courses scheme

### **Extra-Curricular Credit**

R. A. Podar College of Commerce & Economics (Autonomous) organises extracurricular activities for students in addition to the academic curriculum. A student can earn 2 credits per year and a maximum of 6 credits in 3 years through ECA. The purpose of extracurricular activities is primarily the acquisition of skills and competencies in areas that are not directly part of the study programme. The activity hours accumulated throughout the year shall be calculated by the ECCC to fix the number of credits to be granted to students at the end of the year. (Note: 30 hours =1 credit)

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### **1. What is the ECC Committee?**

A - The ECCC or the Extra Curricular Credit Committee is a credit assigning committee which provides opportunities for students to engage in various extracurricular activities and earn credits too. It provides a platform for students to gain an all-round learning experience by participating in various events and workshops and assuming various roles of responsibility.

#### **2. What are Extra Curricular Credits (ECC) and how many hours do I need?**

A - Extra-Curricular Credits (ECC) are awarded to students for participating in workshops, events or college festivals. All students registered for ECC, can earn a maximum of 6(180 hours) credits over three years.

#### **3. How do I earn ECC Hours?**

A- ECC can be earned by participating in college festivals and forum activities and also intercollegiate activities in the form of representing the college in research paper competitions debates quizzes, sports, cultural activities etc. Hours can be earned by those who participate either as part of the contingent or individual.

#### **4. Which seminars/webinars can I attend?**

A - The seminars/webinars organised by college, sponsored or supported by college will only be considered.

The non-registered students working for NSS activities can earn maximum 2 credit points if the students of youth festival do not qualify for the final round or do not get podium rank in the final round, then they are eligible to get 2 credit points. These students can also work for other forums and earn hours.		
6. All values denotes number of ECC points and each ECC point has an equivalence of 1 ECC hour, 60 ECC hours= 2 credits.		
7. Paper presentation will get 10 points per paper, regardless of the year of study. However, only 10 ECC points can be claimed per year via paper presentation		
8. Participation in research related certified workshops and seminars will be provided maximum of 5 ECC points per year, regardless of the year of study. The workshop/ seminar must be certified by the ECC committee.		



9. Notional hours will be granted to only college sponsored or recommended seminars/ workshops / conferences organised by outside organisation / education institute
10. Maximum two credits can be earned from one forum in 3 years.

### **Internship**

All students are hereby required to follow the steps given below to avail 5 credit points on completion of internship for the above-mentioned academic year.

- **Application For NOC:** To apply for NOC, the learner must visit the link given below:

- While applying for NOC, the student needs to attach screen shot of the correspondence/ appointment letter received, confirming the commencement of the internship.
- Once the learner receives NOC from the college, he/she can start with the internship.
- After the completion of internship, the learner is required to fill the submission form (<https://forms.gle/uq4qfq8ktadsgosn9>). For more details about the submissions to be made along with the submission form, learners are required to visit the credit courses page on the college website.
- Once the complete form is received by the concerned authorities, a viva voce is conducted.

### **Note:**

- The internship undertaken should be for minimum 150 hours spread across 30 working days.
- The internship cannot be undertaken at the cost of academics/ required attendance.
- Undertaking of the internship does not reclude the student of his/her academic obligations.
- The credits for completion of internship can be availed only once during the under graduate course.

### **Student Induction Program (SIP)**

The Student Induction Programme is a welcoming and supportive experience for new students and is conducted to provide a coherent and effective introduction to college life. The

programme will contain social activities that encourage students to get to know each other and to become acquainted with the college, the location of key staff, facilities and services. Students can earn 3 credits from the SIP.

- The first page must include:
  1. Name
  2. PRN number
  3. Class
  4. Roll No
  5. Index including list of completed and submitted courses
- For the submissions of online courses, following are the requisites :
  1. Certificate of the COMPLETED and SUBMITTED course.
  2. Report for the completed course mentioning the LEARNER'S EXPERIENCE submitted on google form
  3. PPT mentioning the LEARNING OUTCOMES submitted on google form
  4. Marksheet / Progress report / Any other document mentioning marks scored by student (If any)

- While making submissions for mask for all initiative activity, following are the requisites:
  1. IMAGES OF MASKS made by student
  2. Report including the following details:
    - (i) RELEVANCE of masks made by student
    - (ii) IMPORTANCE of masks made by student
    - (iii) TESTIMONIAL written by parent of the student
- For the submissions of communication skills course, following are the requisites:
  1. Screenshot displaying the COMPLETION of course (NAME should be clearly visible in the screenshot)
  2. Report for the completed course mentioning the LEARNER'S EXPERIENCE submitted on google form
  3. PPT mentioning the LEARNING OUTCOME submitted on google form.
  4. Marksheet / Progress report / Any other document mentioning marks scored by student (If any)
- The student who has completed 12 credit points can take printout of the documents as per the guidelines. They can spiral bind these printed documents and make the submissions.
