

- 16.3 Students must not loiter about or congregate in the College premises while the classes are in progress.
- 16.4 Students shall not indulge in any illegal activity either inside or outside the college that will, in any way, interfere with the orderly administration and discipline.
- 16.5 Students must take proper care of the College property and help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Any damage done to the property of the College will have to be made good by the students concerned. Scribbling on walls and desks in class rooms is strictly prohibited.
